In 2023, our outreach programs reached over 5,000 young people across the Midlands employing a dozen local jazz artists.

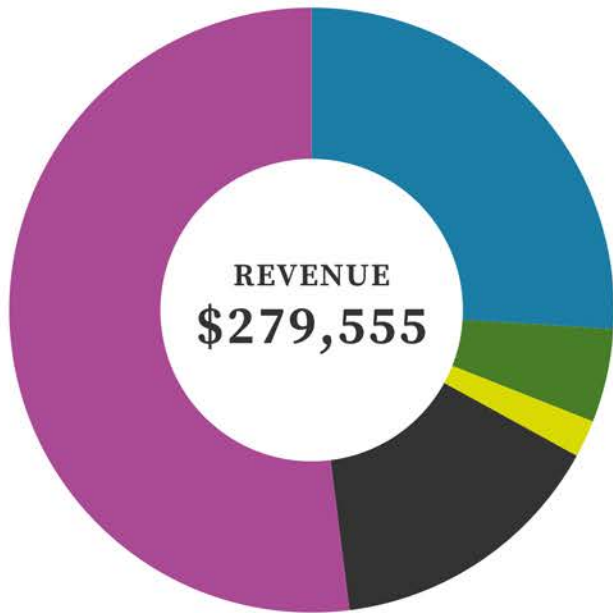

The ColaJazz Foundation has a physical office space with a room for concerts and clinics. Our Board of Directors had some changes this past year and we've added a few incredible talents to the team. Our statewide SC Public Radio show, *ColaJazz Presents...*, produced by Shari Hutchinson of Marian McPartland's *Piano Jazz* fame, was renewed for a 4th season. Thanks to the work of local jazz great, Sam Edwards, we launched our ColaJazz Academy including a variety of jazz classes and combos.

The ColaJazz Foundation was the recipient of a few wonderful grant awards. ColaJazz and our Executive Director earned a couple "Best of..." accolades. Our Executive Director is recognized by Columbia Business Monthly as one of the Top 50 Most Influential leaders - an incredible achievement.

COLAJAZZ ACADEMY

ColaJazz offers a unique series of jazz classes and workshops taught by authorities of their crafts. These sessions are for anyone who enjoys learning, growing, and exploring jazz music. Classes range from theory, history, arranging, business, styles, and more!



Also under our Academy umbrella, we have two Adult Jazz Combo classes meeting weekly to learn tunes, improvisational approaches and work up a public performance opportunity at our celebrated Loft Sessions and one on International Jazz Day at The Joint at 1710 Main Street.



COLAJAZZ SUMMER JAZZ CAMPS

Since 2016, ColaJazz offers summer intensives for all ages. From our middle and high school jazzers to our adult jazz cats, we provide exceptional jazz camp experiences.

Students - young and old(er) - participate in large band ensembles, small combos, theory, improv, elective courses (marketing, budgeting, social media, etc.), masterclasses and grand finale performances.

Additionally, students learn about communication, self-discovery, and finding value in the individual while celebrating and supporting a group.

2023 saw a largest attendance yet in our Middle & High School camp, up 30% from 2022. And we had a dedicated strings combo for the very first time. The Adult Jazz camp saw increased attendance and the campers enjoyed performing on the beautiful mezzanine level of the Koger Center for the Arts.

COLAJAZZ OUTREACH

From performing arts centers to small classrooms and extended care facilities, Colajazz is out there!

Bringing jazz music to young people who have never seen a jazz band or have heard of Louis Armstrong or what “improvise” means is one of our greatest passions. Bringing a music concert to extended care patients is powerful beyond measure.

These programs also give our local musicians meaningful work and income.

Young people learn vital life skills through our programs, as well as, gaining an appreciation of America’s original art form. They learn:

- Creative expression (thinking outside the box, being courageous)
- Role of instruments (working well with others, social skills)
- Soloing and “Trading 4’s” (conflict & resolution, effective communication)
- Jazz history (understanding of the world around them)

In 2023, we presented 22 outreach programs reaching well over 5,000 young people across the Midlands and employed a dozen local jazz artists.





COLAJAZZ CONCERTS

ColaJazz offers world-class jazz concerts throughout the ENTIRE year. We presented 43 public concerts in 2023, most of them giving our local artists incredible performance opportunities.

2023 highlights include: Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra featuring Wynton Marsalis, Live in the Lobby with top New Orleans artists, intimate Loft Sessions and the Main Street Jazz Fest!

COLAJAZZ ON-AIR



A collaboration between South Carolina Public Radio and The ColaJazz Foundation, *ColaJazz Presents...* is a special limited series featuring performances from a diverse group of South Carolina’s top jazz musicians, plus interviews offering intimate perspectives into their lives, communities, and passion for music. *ColaJazz Presents...* entering its 4th season, is produced by Shari Hutchinson, former producer of Marian McPartland’s *Piano Jazz*.

Rapp on Jazz highlights the Palmetto State’s connection to the history of jazz music and the current jazz scene. These 60-second segments cover everything from famous South Carolinians like Dizzy Gillespie and Eartha Kitt to the “Big Apple” dance craze of the 1930s to the best clubs to experience jazz in the state.
