CALL TO ORDER

The Columbia City Council conducted a meeting on Tuesday, February 6, 2024 at City Hall (Council Chambers), 1737 Main Street, Columbia, South Carolina. The Honorable Daniel J. Rickenmann, Mayor called the meeting to order at 4:21 p.m. and the following members were present: The Honorable Aditi Bussells, The Honorable Tina N. Herbert, The Honorable Peter M. Brown, and The Honorable Tyler D. Bailey. The Honorable Will Brennan, Mayor Pro-Tem participated remotely. The Honorable Edward H. McDowell, Jr. was absent. Also present were Ms. Teresa Wilson, City Manager and Ms. Erika D. Moore Hammond, City Clerk. This meeting was advertised in accordance with the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act.

Award to Vortex Services, LLC in an amount not to exceed \$2,279,236.74. The current term of the contract ends on June 30, 2024. This firm is located in Greenville, SC. - *Approved*

Funding Source: Water & Sewer Capital Projects - Capital Project Costs (5529999-SS678624-658650). The current budget amount is \$2,279,236.74. The budget amount for this amendment is \$2,279,236.74. The total revised budget amount is \$4,558,473.48.

This is a Columbia Disadvantaged Business Enterprise program project with a 25% CDBE goal. The CDBE goal for this project was met at 25%. Vortex Services, LLC is the prime contractor and will provide manhole rehabilitation services at 44.28% (\$1,009,236.74) of the amendment amount.

Dr. Bussells said this is another major change order. I would like for Clint to come up and explain why the additional funds are needed for this rehabilitation project and if there was anything we could have done to avoid such an increase.



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Mr. Clint Shealy, P.E., Assistant City Manager for Columbia Water said it's essentially an annual contract for manhole rehabilitation services. This is the second assignment. The first one was a time extension. It's a negotiated scope for the next phase of work that's happening. It's different from other construction contracts. This was planned all along. Next year, you can expect another amendment of that magnitude if we identify work that needs to be done.
