



COLUMBIA CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES TUESDAY, APRIL 1, 2025

CALL TO ORDER

The Columbia City Council conducted a regular meeting on Tuesday, April 1, 2025 at City Hall (Council Chambers), 1737 Main Street, Columbia, South Carolina 29201. The Honorable Daniel J. Rickenmann, Mayor called the meeting to order at 4:07 p.m. and the following members were present: The Honorable Edward H. McDowell, Jr., The Honorable Will Brennan, Mayor Pro-Tem, The Honorable Aditi Bussells, The Honorable Tina N. Herbert, The Honorable Peter M. Brown, and The Honorable Tyler D. Bailey. Also present were Ms. Teresa Wilson, City Manager and Ms. Erika D. Moore Hammond, City Clerk. This meeting was advertised in accordance with the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act.

INVOCATION

Reverend Geneva Stafford, Pastor of Francis Burns United Methodist Church offered the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Upon a motion made by Mr. Brennan and seconded by Mr. McDowell, Council voted unanimously to adopt the agenda as amended, with the withdrawal of **Item 25** (Zoning Map Amendment for 1205 Colleton Street).

PUBLIC INPUT

Mr. Regan Freeman expressed appreciation for **Item 26** (Third Amendment to Lease for the Amtrak Station), praised the city's efforts to improve walkability, and hoped for future collaborations to increase daytime train service.

7. Council is asked to approve the Purchase of Two (2) Tow-Behind Debris Collectors for the Public Works Department, as requested by the Fleet Services Division on February 7, 2025. Award to Carolina Industrial Equipment Company, using the North Carolina Sheriffs' Association Cooperative Contract, in the amount of \$152,360.38. This vendor is located in Charlotte, NC. – *Approved*

Funding Source: Capital Replacement - Auto, Trucks, Heavy Equipment-Capital (6308972-658500). The original budget amount is \$152,360.38.



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8. Council is asked to approve a new Construction Contract for Faison Drive Resurfacing Project, as requested by the Public Works Department on November 21, 2024. Award to True Rock Construction, LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$639,338.08 which includes contingency. The initial term of the contract will take effect upon issuance of the Notice to Proceed with an end date thirty (30) days from commencement. This firm is located in Monroe, NC. – *Approved*

Funding Source: Street Resurfacing Capital Project - Resurface Faison Drive - Capital Project Costs (4079999-SR914401-658650). The original budget amount is \$639,338.08.

True Rock Construction, LLC is the prime contractor and will provide paving services at 88.20% (\$536,202.90) of the total contract amount.

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Mr. Henry Simons, Assistant City Manager of Operations shared that the project is progressing well. The contract amendment includes repairs to tennis courts damaged by Hurricane Helene. These repairs also include new fencing and accessible connectivity. The courts will continue to support both tennis and pickle ball. The project is expected to be completed soon.

Mr. Clint Shealy, P.E., Assistant City Manager of Columbia Water outlined that this phase extends improvements from Blossom Street to Pendleton Street and south to Lady Street, including pedestrian safety, ADA compliance, underground utilities, and beautification to enhance the State House entryway. A \$3 million funding shortfall remains. Public input will be sought soon after the contract is issued.



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16.
