This will include review, design, bidding, and construction services at 62.84% (\$141,913.00) of the amendment amount.

When we appoint to outside entities, we go by their bylaws which do not have the same restriction. We can appoint anyone to the outside entity. That is based on the bylaws I was given to review today.

Upon a motion made by Mayor Rickenmann and seconded by Ms. Herbert, Council voted unanimously to appoint Ms. Kamaria Mosely to the Columbia Housing Authority Board of Commissioners for five year term.

Upon a motion made by Mayor Rickenmann and seconded by Mr. Brown, Council voted five to two (5 to 2) to appoint Ms. Karen Jenkins to the Columbia Housing Authority Board of Commissioners. Mr. Bailey, Mr. Brown, Mr. Brennan, Mr. McDowell, and Mayor Rickenmann voted aye. Ms. Herbert and Dr. Bussells voted nay.

You can apply or be nominated this month as well. There is also a hospitality sector position that is open to anyone that runs or owns a business in our certified hospitality districts. There will be a strategic planning session to determine the focus. We have been a member of the International Town and Gown Association for many years and we wanted to create a new format that best fits Columbia.

Mayor Rickenmann referred the creation of a peddler permit ordinance to the Public Safety Committee. He said as our city grows and for everyone's safety, we need to know who's selling what. From peddlers to local businesses, it's important that we update the ordinances that we have.

Councilor Bailey asked for the definition of a peddler.

Mayor Rickenmann said someone who is selling items on the street or soliciting on the street without any type of permit.

Councilor Herbert requested that appointments for the Capital City/Lake Murray Regional Tourism Board be placed on the April 16, 2024 agenda.

Dr. Bussells announced that a press conference will be held on April 4, 2024 for Black Maternal Health Week. There will be a Mom's Health Market at the Drew Wellness Center on Saturday April 6, 2024 from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. It is free and is a great way for you all to get to know the different resources available in the greater Midlands community. There are also many other events happening next week that are being led by the Black Maternal Health Collective, including Talk to a Doctor and screening of "Birthing Justice".
