RESOLUTION NO.: R-2016-073*Authorizing Notice of Special Election for City Council District 4*

WHEREAS, a vacancy in office occurred in City Council District 4 on Wednesday, September 28, 2016, which term ends on December 31, 2017; and,

WHEREAS, S.C. Code of Laws §5-7-200(b) requires that a vacancy in office shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term at the next regular election or at a special election if the vacancy occurs one hundred eighty days or more prior to the next general election; and,

WHEREAS, the City will conduct a special election to fill the vacancy in the District 4 Council seat; and,

WHEREAS, S.C. Code of Laws §7-13-190 requires that, for any nonpartisan office, a special election to fill a vacancy in office must be set for the thirteenth Tuesday after the vacancy occurs; and,

WHEREAS, S.C. Code of Laws §5-15-50 requires 60 days' public notice of an election; and,

WHEREAS, S.C. Code of Laws §7-13-35 requires a first notice not later than 60 days before the election and a second notice not later than two weeks after the first notice; and,

WHEREAS, S.C. Code of Laws §7-13-190 requires that the filing of candidacy to fill the vacant public office be opened at noon on the third Friday after the vacancy occurs for a period to close 10 days later at noon; and,

WHEREAS, the deadline for providing the notice to The State newspaper for publication of the notice in the Sunday, October 9, 2016, edition of The State newspaper is 3:00 o'clock p.m. Friday, October 7, 2016, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbia, South Carolina this ____ day of October, 2016, that Tuesday, January 3, 2017 has been set as the date for a special election to fill the vacant City Council District 4 seat; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attached Notice of Election shall be published in The State Newspaper on or before Sunday, October 9, 2016 and again not later than Sunday, October 16, 2016, and the City Clerk is directed to provide a copy of such notice to the South Carolina Ethics Commission.

People desiring to vote in the upcoming election must be registered by Saturday, December 3, 2016. To register, one must contact the County Board of Voter Registration.

Citizens desiring to be candidates for one of the above listed offices must file a statement of candidacy and completed Statement of Economic Interest with the City Clerk, 3rd floor, City Hall, 1737 Main Street, Columbia, South Carolina. Books will be open for filing at noon on Friday, October 14, 2016, and remain open during regular business hours (8:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.) until noon on Monday, October 24, 2016. No statement of candidacy or Statement of Economic Interest will be accepted after noon, Monday, October 24, 2016.

The filing fee for the office of council is \$90.00.

This is a nonpartisan election and no party affiliation shall be placed on the ballot.

The polls shall open at 7:00 a.m. on election day and close at 7:00 p.m.

At 9:00 a.m. on said Election Day the commissioners will begin examination of the absentee ballot return envelopes. This examination will be held in the 1st Floor Conference Room, Richland County Elections and Voter Registration, 2020 Hampton Street, Columbia, South Carolina.

On Thursday, January 5, 2017, at 2:00 p.m. in the 1st Floor Conference Room, Richland County Elections and Voter Registration, 2020 Hampton Street, Columbia, South Carolina, the Municipal Election Commission shall hold a hearing to determine the validity of ballots challenged, if any, in this election.

Any run-off will be held two weeks after the election on Tuesday, January 17, 2017.
